

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SHADOWS IN HARLEM

Shadows in Harlem comes from a series of eight etchings. Smith, who signed his prints as Vincent, filled his prints with a dense, detailed report of Harlem life, condensing the cacophonous vibrant Harlem streets onto a plate. Referring to the works as historical-narratives, he notes school segregation, everyday street scenes of crowds walking, sitting on stoops, storefront signages, and also depicting unimaginable events such as John Coltrane's funeral.

In our second collaboration with Kenny Rivero, we will be launching four NEW Etchings with Chine Collè, and a highlight of monotypes from his work at the shop from 2017. Rivero has been persistently figurative, and consistent in using visual composition as an active memoir. And much like a personal essayist, eloquently ensuring each word has a purpose, his lexicon draws from contemporary history and his Dominican cultural upbringing with immigrant parents in Washington Heights. The city, for Rivero as well, is a reputable subject, yet unlike the Vincent, in Rivero's cityscape we often see a lone figure, littered pavement with a single rose, tossed knifes, floating numbers, and freckled with dominoes; as buildings with broken windows and peering eyes in place of bricks—we gather clues, create assumptions, and try to collect meaning from his incantations.

KENNY RIVERO + VINCENT DACOSTA SMITH



Kenny Rivero (b. 1981) born Washington Heights, NY. He earned a BFA from the School of Visual Arts in 2006 and an MFA from the Yale School of Art in 2012. Recent projects and exhibitions include: MASS MoCA; Pera Museum, Turkey; Stedelijk Museum, Netherlands; The Contemporary Art Museum St Louis; Pérez Art Museum, Miami; Sugar Hill Children's Museum of Art & Storytelling, New York; El Museo del Barrio, New York; Delaware Contemporary, Wilmington; and upcoming, Charles Moffatt Gallery, New York, NY.

Vincent Dacosta Smith (b. 1929-2003) born in NYC. After leaving high school, enlisting in the army for one year, Smith worked on train tracks in Long Island for several months, before returning to NYC to study at the Art Student's League. His early paintings were influenced by African masks at the Brooklyn Museum, as well, full of references of political events, jazz and literature. After traveling to multiple regions of Africa and parts of the Caribbean (including his parent emigrated from Barbados), his paintings were mixed with sand, and the content became focused on a global African network.






Chine Collé backed with Methylcellulose glue and cut










Panther 2017 Oil Monotype 18.5 x 20.5 in. \$2,500
